Background Information: The Seven Years War

The Seven Years War took place between 1756-1763 and represented the first global conflict, fought on multiple continents. The French and British forces in North America, based by New France and the Thirteen colonies respectively, clashed over territorial dominance and influence in the area. The colony of New France was lead by its governor Marquis de Vaudreuil, and its intendent, Francois Bigot. The Lieutenant General of the French military force was Marquis de Montcalm.

“My **antagonist** has wisely shut himself up in **inaccessible entrenchments**, so that I can’t get at him without spilling a **torrent** of blood, and that perhaps to little purpose. The Marquis de Montcalm is at the head of a great number of bad soldiers, and I am at the head of a small number of good ones, that wish for nothing so much as to fight him – but the **wary** old fellow avoids an action doubtful of the behaviour of his army. People must be of the profession to understand the disadvantages and difficulties we labour under arising from the uncommon natural strength of the country.”
