### **Background Information: The Conscription Debate**

Canada's participation in World War I was marked by significant contributions to the Allied cause. As part of the British Empire, Canada sent over 600,000 troops to the Western Front. The ongoing and increasing demand for troops, coupled with a declining number of volunteers, led the Canadian government led by Robert Borden and the Union Party to implement conscription, or forced military service (sometimes called Compulsory Equal Service) through the passing of the Military Service Act in 1918.
