Background Information: The Laws of St. Laurent were a set of rules established by the Métis in 1873 to regulate bison hunting and maintain order in their community near the St. Laurent settlement in present-day Saskatchewan.

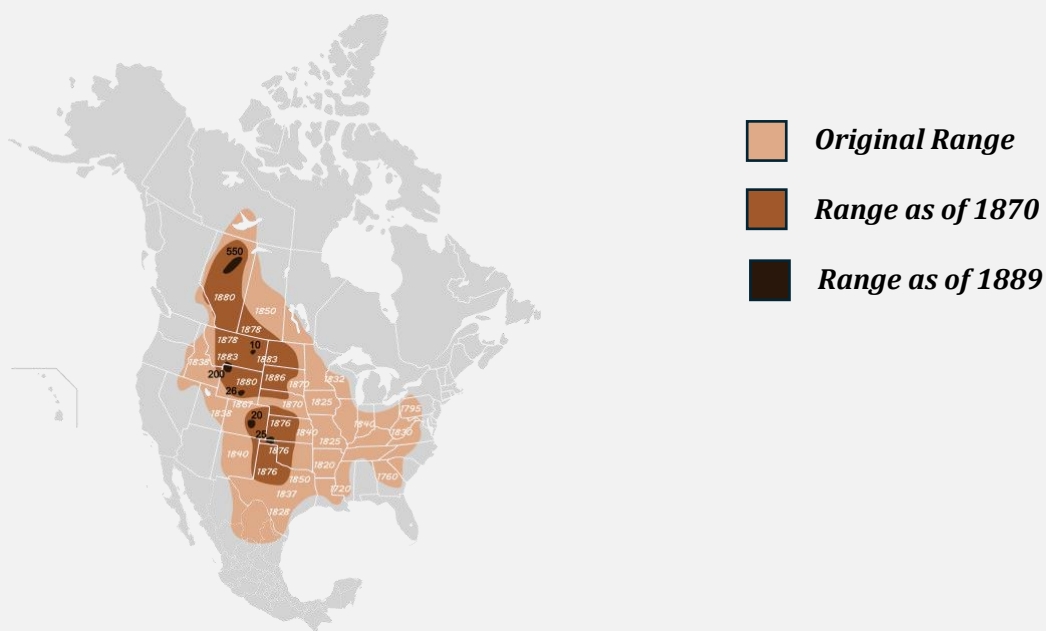
Source A:

...the Colony of St. Laurent, no longer having the right to punish the **delinquents** naturally lost all **sanction**[authority]...Everyone took their freedom and ran on the buffalo without any other guide than their **insatiable keenness**, passion for killing, greed and **avarice**. **Anarchy** and self-interest reigned on the prairie. They **exterminated** the poor buffalo with more **frenzy** than ever.
